# COMPLAINTS and suggestions

All complaints should be submitted in writing, in a sealed envelope and delivered to City Hall. Your complaint must include the following information:

- ⇒ Full name of the plaintiff
- ⇒ Full address of the plaintiff
- Phone number
- ⇒ Specific details of the problem
- **⇒** Specific location of the problem
- ⇒ Date(s) of the event(s), if known
- Signature of the plaintiff

ANONYMOUS COMPLAINTS WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED.

Under no circumstances will it be tolerated for any citizen to call or go directly to the homes of our municipal employees.

For any emergency, we kindly ask you to refer to pages 4, 10, 11 and 14 of this issue.

# COMPOST delivery

Compost produced from organic materials collected by households in our territory helps reduce greenhouse gases (GHGs) by diverting a significant amount of residual materials from disposal sites. It also promotes urban agriculture at a lower cost.

You can have compost delivered to you at a cost of \$15 / cubic meter (1 m³). Limit of one delivery per property. Visit our website for more details.

# 2023 MUNICIPAL TAXES

The tax account is sent to the owner in January. It is your responsibility to forward it to your mortgage creditor if he takes care of making the payments.

We strongly encourage paying taxes through your financial institution's website. You can also deposit your cheques in the mailbox located to the right of the main entrance.

1st installment : FEBRUARY 7
 2nd installment : MAY 26
 3rd installment : AUGUST 25
 4th installment : NOVEMBER 10

### Receive our ALERTS

It is imperative that you register now to the alert system so that you can be reached quickly, by email, in the event of an emergency. This is the means we use to inform you of the measures taken by the Municipality, particularly in crisis management.

Registering for this alert system will only take you a minute and will allow you to react quickly in the event of a major incident such as a flood, an evacuation notice, a boil water advisory or any other emergency that may jeopardize your health or safety.

To access this free service, simply register online at www.terrasse-vaudreuil.ca under the "INSCRIPTION AUX ALERTES" tab. You will also be able to customize the level of alerts you want to receive.



# **ANIMALS**

#### PETS

The Municipality ensures people and pet safety on its territory by means of the animal control. The **Contrôle animal Vaudreuil-Soulanges** has the authority to intervene on behalf of the Municipality either by picking up or capturing a lost, injured or dead pet, taking it to the vet, providing it with shelter or putting it up for adoption if it remains unclaimed after **four (4) days**. **All costs incurred must be paid by the owner.** 

BY CIVIC SENSE AND TO RESPECT THE REGULATION, we ask the owners of dogs and cats, not to leave their animal loose.

You must purchase a MANDATORY cat or dog licence at the cost of \$30 (for the life of the animal) at City Hall. Do not forget to inform us of any change in your file (phone number, spayed or neutered, death of the animal, etc.). It is forbidden to keep more than two (2) dogs and two (2) cats older than eight (8) weeks per unit of occupation and dependants.

# **ANIMAL CONTROL: 450 510-1508**

#### CANINE BEHAVIOR



All dogs, regardless of breed, will be treated equally and without discrimination in the event of aggressive behavior. The controller may submit them to an expert in animal behavior for evaluation if he deems it necessary.

Under the Act to promote the protection of people by setting up a framework for dogs in a public place, a dog must at all times be under the control of a person capable of controlling it. Except in a dog exercise area or when participating in a canine activity, in particular hunting, an exhibition, a competition or training lessons, a dog must also be held by means of a leash of a maximum length of 1.85 m. A dog weighing 20 kg and over must also wear a halter or harness at all times, attached to its leash. A dog may not be on property belonging to a person other than its owner or guardian, unless the presence of the dog has been expressly authorized.

# WILDLIFE in urban areas

- Never approach unfamiliar animals (wild or domesticated) even if they appear healthy, or seem to have been abandoned;
- Supervise your children to make sure they do not approach or provoke unfamiliar animals;
- Do not let your pets run wild;
- Do not capture sick wild animals to move them to another location; this could spread the disease to other regions;
- To avoid attracting wild animals onto your property,
  - ⇒ remove all sources of food from around your house;
  - ⇒ keep outdoor garbage cans out of reach;
  - ⇒ block off any areas where raccoons or skunks could settle (install a wire mesh under balconies and garden sheds).

#### **NEW BY-LAW**

# WATER from the AQUEDUCT

The use of water from the municipal aqueduct for watering lawns, gardens, flowers, trees, shrubs and other plants is prohibited between March 1 and November 1 of each year, except between 7 p.m. and 9 p.m., the following days:

#### **MONDAYS AND THURSDAYS**

▶ It is prohibited to let the water from the irrigation flow into the street or onto a neighboring property.

Manual watering of annual flowers and hanging planters is permitted, every day, between 7 p.m. and 9 p.m.

# WATERING permit

A person who installs or sows a new lawn may, provided that he holds **a permit** issued for this purpose at a cost of \$45 by the Municipality and after having paid the tariff, proceed to watering this new lawn **between 7:00 p.m.** and 9:00 p.m., every day for a period of fifteen (15) consecutive days, from the start of the installation or seeding work, with the exception of the watering ban period.

## **WASHING of HOUSES**

The washing of houses is authorized **twice (2) a year**. The owner must, beforehand, obtain a permit at City Hall at a cost of **\$25**.

# **BOAT** ramp

Reserved parking spaces at the boat ramp situated on 1<sup>st</sup> Boulevard (Gilles-Dicaire Park) are strictly reserved for citizens of Terrasse-Vaudreuil.

The boat ramp is padlocked. The purchase of a key is mandatory each year. It is available at City Hall, at a cost of \$15, when the dock is installed. We will give you a parking "permit" for control purposes. This must remain visible at all times.

It is forbidden to park your vehicle on the lawn, in the boat ramp or on the edge of it. The offenders could be fined.



Please leave your "permit" visible on the dashboard of your vehicle.

#### GARAGE SALE

Anyone wishing to hold a garage sale on a residential property must first obtain a **permit free of cost** from the Municipality.

This sale can take place for a maximum period of two (2) days (or three (3) during a statutory holiday). The authorized hours for a garage sale are **from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m.** Publicity posting is only tolerated on the property of the permit holder.

**Two (2)** garage sales are authorized in the same calendar year per residence.



Anyone who contravenes these rules commits an offense and is liable to a minimum fine of \$150 plus costs. Each subsequent violation is subject to a fine of \$300 plus costs.

# **BY-LAWS**

# GARDENS in front yard and secondary front yard

Zoning by-law no. 572 has been amended to allow vegetable gardens in the front yard and secondary front yard under the following conditions:

- ► The land in question is located in a residential, commercial, industrial or public area;
- ▶ That the vegetable garden be located at a minimum distance of 50 centimeters from the side lines of the lot and the right-of-way of the public thoroughfare;
- ▶ That the height of the plantations does not exceed one (1) meter over a distance of two (2) meters measured from the right-of-way of the public thoroughfare;
- ▶ That the materials used to delimit the planting areas be limited to wood, concrete blocks or natural stone and that their height does not exceed one (1) meter;



- ▶ That the removable structures used to support the plantations do not exceed in height one (1) meter over a distance of two (2) meters measured from the right-of-way of the public thoroughfare and 1.5 m elsewhere in the front yard and that their materials be limited to wood, metal and plastic in a sober and uniform color. No height limit is required for structures supporting climbing plants when attached to the main building;
- ▶ That these removable structures be removed between November 1 of one year and April 15 of the following year;
- ▶ That no tree be cut for the development of the vegetable garden.

### DOOR-TO-DOOR

To have the right to go door-to-door, regardless of the reason, one must submit a written request to the Municipal Council. Once this one has been approved, a permit authorizing peddling will be issued and the peddler must have this permit in his possession at all times. Insist on seeing it!

If the peddler cannot submit a permit issued by the Municipality of Terrasse-Vaudreuil, it is recommended that you call directly the Sûreté du Québec at 450 424-1212 and provide them with the facts and a description of the individual.

# ROAD SAFFTY COMMITTEE

Road safety is one of the municipality's priorities. In 2022, a Safety Committee made up of elected officials and volunteer citizens gave itself the mandate to promote road safety and encourage citizens to adopt responsible behavior on public roads through the awareness campaign "For whom do you do it ».

The Committee also looked into the issue of parking and safety at the beach and shared its observations with the Municipal Council who will study the issue in the coming weeks. It will continue to be active over the coming months and will implement the concerted actions on the island in terms of road safety.

### Regional road safety campaign Sécur'ÎLE

Composed, among others, of the municipalities and towns of Pincourt, Notre-Dame-de-l'Ile-Perrot, L'Ile-Perrot and Terrasse-Vaudreuil, as well as the Sûreté du Québec, a new regional committee aims to unite the awareness, education and operational efforts to encourage the various target audiences to adopt safe behavior on the road network and to take responsibility for this.



Thus, a vast campaign will be deployed and will place citizens at the heart of it. Posters will be installed everywhere on Île Perrot. The partners will use, in particular, educational radars for certain targeted places and social networks to disseminate their awareness messages.

### **DEFECTIVE GATES**



When the gates at the Terrasse-Vaudreuil railway crossing are defective, please contact the Railway Police directly at **1 800 551-2553** and go through the L'Île-Perrot North entrance.

#### PUBLIC RAIL SAFETY

Every year in Canada, approximately 300 collisions and trespassing incidents occur at highway/railway crossings and along railway tracks resulting in the death or serious injury of nearly 130 people.

In fact, all of these incidents could have been avoided. Statistics show that **Operation LifeSaver's** education works! We encourage you to visit their website at <u>www.operationlifesaver.ca</u>, an interesting interactive rail-safety site directed to children, it includes stories, games, audio and visual clips, posters and safety tips.

Whether on foot or in a vehicle, the only place you should ever cross railway tracks is at an authorized and properly marked crossing. When you approach or cross a railway track, look and listen for another train approaching from either direction. Never drive around the gates. If the gate is down, or in the process of being raised or lowered, do not cross the tracks.




# FIRE PREVENTION

# OUTDOOR FIREPLACE | Open outdoor fires

#### Do you want to make an outdoor fire?

- **⊃** It is mandatory to have a regulatory fireplace:
  - ♦ Be installed on a non-combustible surface
  - ♦ Be equipped with a spark arrester with openings no larger than 1 cm.
  - Be installed in the backyard at a minimum distance of three (3) meters from any building and property line
  - ♦ Be of a total height of 2.3 meters







### BBO

Cooking on the barbecue gives food a unique taste! It is important to follow the following advice in order to use it safely.

#### Your grill should:

- ⇒ Be placed outdoors, in a well-ventilated area and installed on a solid and stable surface, at a safe clearance distance from any combustible object or material (walls, doors, trees, etc.), away from any traffic or area game;
- Be well connected to your bottle.

#### With each use, you must:

- Open the lid of the barbecue before fully opening the tank valve;
- Open a gas control valve and operate the built-in igniter or use a long-nosed lighter or a long match in the hole near the open burner;
- Avoid leaning over the appliance when lighting;
- Monitor your barbecue at all times when it is in operation;
- ⇒ Never move the barbecue when it is lit;
- Close the gas cylinder valve;
- ⇒ When the flame is out, turn off all gas controls and close the barbecue lid.

Warning! If your barbecue does not light immediately, turn off the gas control controls and wait several minutes before trying again.

#### **FIREWORKS**

Your Fire Department would like to remind you that it is forbidden to make fireworks on the entire territory of the Municipality of Terrasse-Vaudreuil.

Anyone who contravenes this by-law commits an offense and is liable to a minimum fine of \$300 plus fees.

#### Smoke ALARMS

Negligence, distraction and recklessness are the causes of the majority of residential fires. You can protect yourself against fires with simple actions:

- ⇒ Install at least one (1) smoke alarm per floor of your home, including the basement;
- Check their operation regularly;
- Make an evacuation plan for your home;
- Practice evacuating it.

### MATERIALS REFUSED IN THE WASTE AND LARGE ITEMS COLLECTION

In an effort to reduce our ecological footprint and the impact on our public finances, we are redoubling our efforts to significantly reduce the amount of waste that, until now, has gone to landfill. The collection of household waste and large items does not include the following items that may be accepted at the ecocenter or in specific municipal collections (\*).

Here are some examples of what is <u>not accepted</u> in **Tuesday's collections**:

Polystyrene and plastic (food packaging, packaging or construction)



\*Cardboard / paper (boxes, wrapping paper, paper)

Construction materials / excavation materials

(ex.: wood, treated wood, plywood, drywall, moldings, ceramic, insulation, pipes, concrete, etc.)

Halocarbons

(refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers etc.)

Tires (with or without rims)

Asphalt shingles

Hazardous household waste (aerosols, adhesives, fuel, oils, chemicals etc.)

Paint, light bulbs, batteries, cells

Soil, rocks, gravel

Electronics

(televisions, computers, printers, cellular phones etc.)

\*Green waste (grass, weeds, plants and flowers)

\*Organic waste (food waste, napkins, tissues)

Wood (logs, branches, trunks, stumps)

# **HOUSEHOLD WASTE**

#### **TUESDAYS**

Construction materials are not accepted in the collection. Most non-compostable and non-recyclable materials can and should now be brought to the ecocentre.

#### BIN POSITIONING

Garbage, recycling bins and brown bins must be left at the curb <u>before 7 a.m.</u> It is prohibited to leave the bins outside the permitted period, from 4 p.m. the day before collection until 12 p.m. the day after the collection.

#### HOW TO PLACE YOUR BIN:

- ⇒ Place the bin at a maximum of one (1) meter from the curb;
- ⇒ The wheels must be turned toward the building so that the lid opens toward the street:
- ⇒ Make sure there is a 60 cm clearance all around the bin;
- ⇒ The lid must be closed and no items deposited next or outside the bin are picked up.

# BINS NOT POSITIONED PROPERLY OR WITHOUT A LID WILL NOT BE PICKED UP.

Note that all bins identified by the Vaudreuil-Soulanges logo are municipal property and are associated with an address. If you move, you must leave them behind.

# SPECIAL CARDBOARD COLLECTION

### THURSDAY, JULY 6, 2023

- ⇒ Cardboard boxes should be taken apart and put into a single box, or stacked and tied with rope or clear tape and placed next to your blue bin.
- ⇒ The boxes must be empty (no bag, no styrofoam, polystyrene or other material).
- ⇒ Very large boxes (furniture, appliances, televisions, etc.) must be cut out and joined to other boxes to be picked up.
- Only cardboard can be placed next to the bin for this special collection.

# LARGE/BULKY ITEMS

Until July 29, bulky waste can be placed at the curb, each week, at the same time as the collection of residual materials. Starting in August 2023, collection will be monthly. Consult the list of materials refused on page 16.

We encourage you to: REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE, RECOVER!

# MAINTENANCE/REPLACEMENT OF BINS

The Municipality of Terrasse-Vaudreuil provides its residents with blue recycling bins of **360 liters at a cost of \$102 each.** 

As of June 2023, 240 liters bins (brown for food waste and black for residual materials) will be distributed to the population. Changes to collections will be updated on our website.

If your bin is broken, contact us to check if it is still under warranty. We will need the serial number of the bin to be repaired/replaced.

This number is engraved or printed on the side of the bin.







#### **BRANCHES**

The Municipality offers, free of charge, seasonal monthly branch pickup. The maximum volume accepted is 4' high by 8' long (branches no larger than 4" in diameter).

#### **MONDAYS**

September 5 (Tuesday)

October 2

November 6

Tree branches must be piled on your property at the curbside, in front of the house, with the cut end facing the street, **before 7:00 a.m. on collection days**. It is strictly forbidden to leave or maintain branches and clippings from bushes and hedges along the street outside the permitted period of three (3) days before the collection date.

Roots, vines and tree stumps will not be accepted.

# **GREEN WASTE**

Green waste can now be mixed with organic matter in the brown bin, every Wednesday.

#### ACCEPTED

- ▶ Spring leaves
- ▶ Weeds and grass
- ► Small branches of less than 1 cm of diameter
- ► Hedge or shrub trimmings
- ► Flowers and plants
- ► Garden and flowerbeds debris

#### **REFUSED**

- ▶ Fall leaves
- ► Branches, tree stumps, logs
- ▶ Soil, stones, gravel
- ▶ Food waste
- ▶ Waste material
- ▶ Ashes

If the amount of green waste exceeds what can be contained in the brown bin, you will have 16 collections where you can use paper bags or open bins identified with a large "V" and place them next to your bin of organic material for collection.

No plastic bag will be picked up even if it is biodegradable. Collections begin at 7 a.m..

#### Home made COMPOST

Green waste is accepted in the collection of organic materials, but we invite you to promote the domestic composter for your plant material, grasscycling and leaf recycling.

Giving back to the earth what belongs to it!

It is ideal to leave the cut grass on the ground and to shred the leaves so that, as they decompose, they return the nutrients and moisture to the soil which are beneficial to it. By the same token, greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions produced by trucks when transporting materials are reduced.

# INVASIVE PLANTS go in the trash!

**IMPORTANT!** Invasive exotic plants (phragmites, giant hogweed, Japanese knotweed, Himalayan impatiens, purple loosestrife) should not be composted or placed in green waste collections. **They go in the trash!** 

Even if you think it's not harmful, **never throw your garden waste in a wooded area!** You could harm the balance of the ecosystem.

# **ORGANIC WASTE**

WARNING! Some items are newly accepted! For example, you can now put your pets' droppings in the brown bin. However, no plastic bag, even if it is deemed biodegradable or compostable, should end up in your bin! This could result in the rejection of a complete batch at the composting platform.

In Canada, we consume almost 330 liters of water per day per person? That's double the Europeans!

#### **HERE ARE 5 TIPS TO SAVE WATER**

#### 1. Turn off the water when not needed

A really effective way is to temporarily turn off the faucet during certain stages of your bath (brushing teeth, soaping, etc.). If everyone took the time to turn off the water for just a few minutes, each family could save dozens of liters of water per day!

#### 2. Take a shower instead of a bath

A shower requires an average of 40 to 60 liters of water, while taking a bath consumes 120 to 200 liters of water. You can also reduce the duration of your shower or stop the water when you apply shampoo. Small, simple gestures that, when combined, can make a difference.

#### 3. Equip your home to save water

There are a multitude of devices that can reduce water consumption at home such as a low-flow shower head, a toilet tank volume reducer or an aerator for the bathroom faucet.

#### 4. Don't neglect the pool

Enjoy the joys of swimming without wasting water unnecessarily? It's possible! Just fill your pool to within 20 centimeters of the edge to limit splashing. Also consider getting a pool liner to cover it and prevent water evaporation on hot summer days.

#### 5. Collect water for reuse

Reuse also applies for drinking water! Among other things, you can take the pasta or vegetable cooking water to water the plants. Or collect rainwater using a barrel to water the garden or wash the car. Use your imagination, you will see that it is easy to reuse water to consume less!

# Reduce, reuse, recycle, recover!

Tricycle is a sorting tool developed by the MRC de Vaudreuil-Soulanges which is part of the CYCLE of reduction, reuse, recycling and recovery of residual materials.

# Expanded POLYSTYRENE recycling program

Did you know that the POLYMOS company in Terrasse-Vaudreuil helps reduce the volume of waste that goes to landfill every week? A large container is placed near the entrance to the community center to allow the citizens of Terrasse-Vaudreuil to dispose of polystyrene items easily and ecologically. Several types of food containers are now accepted if they are clean!

#### SELECT THE PROPER TYPE OF MATERIAL TO RECYCLE

EPS is a highly environmentally friendly component. It is made of 95% air and is harmless to our air, soil as well as to ground water. EPS contains no CFCs and HCFCs and never did.

#### Please differentiate!

EPS (expanded polystyrene typically white in color) of the XPS (extruded polystyrene, better known as Styrofoam®, which is typically pink or blue). Both are made with polystyrene but are produced through different processes making them different in terms of their physical properties.

#### Materials ACCEPTED in the container

- EPS white and clean packaging-source (that we often find in the form of packaging of fragile products) with no food residue, paper, glue, tape, staples, etc.
- Rinsed and dried food packaging bearing the # 6 logo (if the # 6 logo is not on it is not PS)
- Polystyrene packaging
- White construction insulation without vapor barrier
- All products with # 6 logo

Never leave your transport bags in the polystyrene recycling container. Please empty and recycle them where they are accepted.

# Hazardous household waste (HHW)



The Municipality of Terrasse-Vaudreuil would like to remind you that it is forbidden to mix Hazardous Household Waste with the weekly waste pickup. We have already encountered an incident where the firefighters had to take action due to a suspicious smoke emanating from a garbage truck. It turned out that an amount of granular Chlorine had been thrown with the household waste and made a reaction combined with another substance, dangerous or not, which resulted in a chemical reaction releasing lots of heat, causing a toxic and corrosive smoke.



HHW must be brought to the Ecocenter in Vaudreuil-Dorion and should never be thrown away!

# **HEALTH and WELL BEING**









Your municipality would like to remind you of the importance of having an emergency kit at home at all times (e.g., backpack or bin) containing the necessary items to ensure that you are self-sufficient and allow your family to survive the first three (3) days of a disaster (power cut, flood or other).

Here's what your kit should contain:

#### **EMERGENCY KIT (72 HOUR SURVIVAL)**

- Place your emergency kit in an easily accessible place. Check its contents annually and replace batteries and water supplies as needed, as well as expired nonperishable foods.
- Drinking water (6 liters per person)
- Non-perishable food for at least 3 days (canned food, energy bars and dehydrated food)
- Manual can opener
- Battery operated radio spare batteries in separate bag
- Headlamp or flashlight spare batteries or crank lamp
- Lighter or matches and candles
- First aid kit\*

#### FIRST AID KIT (\*)

- Emergency telephone numbers for EMS/9-1-1, the regional poison control center and family physicians
- Home and work phone numbers of relatives, friends or neighbors who can help
- Sterile gauze pads (dressings) in small and large sizes to cover wounds
- Tape
- Roll bandages and triangular bandages to hold dressings in place or to put the arm in a sling
- Adhesive bandages of different sizes
- Scissors
- Tweezers
- Safety pins
- Instant cold compresses
- Latex-free disposable gloves, such as surgical or examination gloves
- Flashlight with spare batteries in a separate bag
- Soap or antiseptic pads
- Pencils and pad of paper
- Emergency blanket
- Eve patches
- Protective equipment, such as pocket mask or protective mask
- Currency to call
- First Aid and CPR Guide
- Whistle
